Extremely saddened to have to announce the passing of WYK64 Peter Chow 周志榮 on Sunday 10th July 2016 in Queen Elizabeth Hospital in Hong Kong. May he rest in peace.

Peter had been admitted into Hong Kong WYK62 group activities many years ago and has been very close to us ever since. He attended our 50th Anniversary as well as our Int'l Gathering 2014 (see album) as well as many of our regular gatherings.

He is a dear, true, sincere and very helpful friend, one of the nicest persons I ever met. Peter shall be sadly and dearly missed by all who knew him. May he now rest in eternal peace in God's embrace in his rightful place.

To Peter's wife Barbara, his three daughters and other family members - we, all WYK62s worldwide - would like to offer our heartfelt and sincerest sympathies & condolences. Peter's passing is a great loss and he shall always remain in our hearts and minds, sadly and dearly missed by all of us !

Peter's passing was the result of a totally unexpected and tragic accident which occurred at his residence around noon on Saturday 2nd July. Peter, according to his brother, used an old wooden A ladder to climb up to try to unblock a drain on the outside wall of the building (he lived on the 1st floor) - an act he had apparently performed more than once before using the same ladder. However, this time, one of the legs of the wooden ladder snapped so suddenly causing Peter to tumble and landed skull down on the concrete floor. I used the word "sudden" because if it was not so - instinct might have saved Peter's life with his hands trying to either cushion the fall or at least tried to protect his head. Anyway, he suffered fractured skull and massive intracranial bleeding and was immediately rendered unconscious. Ambulance was summoned and emergency brain surgery lasting 5 hours was performed by QE's doctors but Peter did not wake up from his coma ever since the operation which ended evening of Saturday 2nd July. Afterwards, Barbara - Peter's wife - was advised to recall Peter's married daughters to Hong Kong, one from New York and the other from San Francisco. Together with an unmarried daughter here in HK, Peter's whole family was there with him throughout from 2 to 10 July when he passed away peacefully without awakening at all from his coma. I am awaiting funeral and other details.

Peter is a close and dear friend, a frank, honest, truthful, sincere and extremely helpful person who is very generous to his friends ! We shall all miss him dearly. May he now rest in eternal peace in his new environment ! He shall be in my thoughts and my heart forever more
