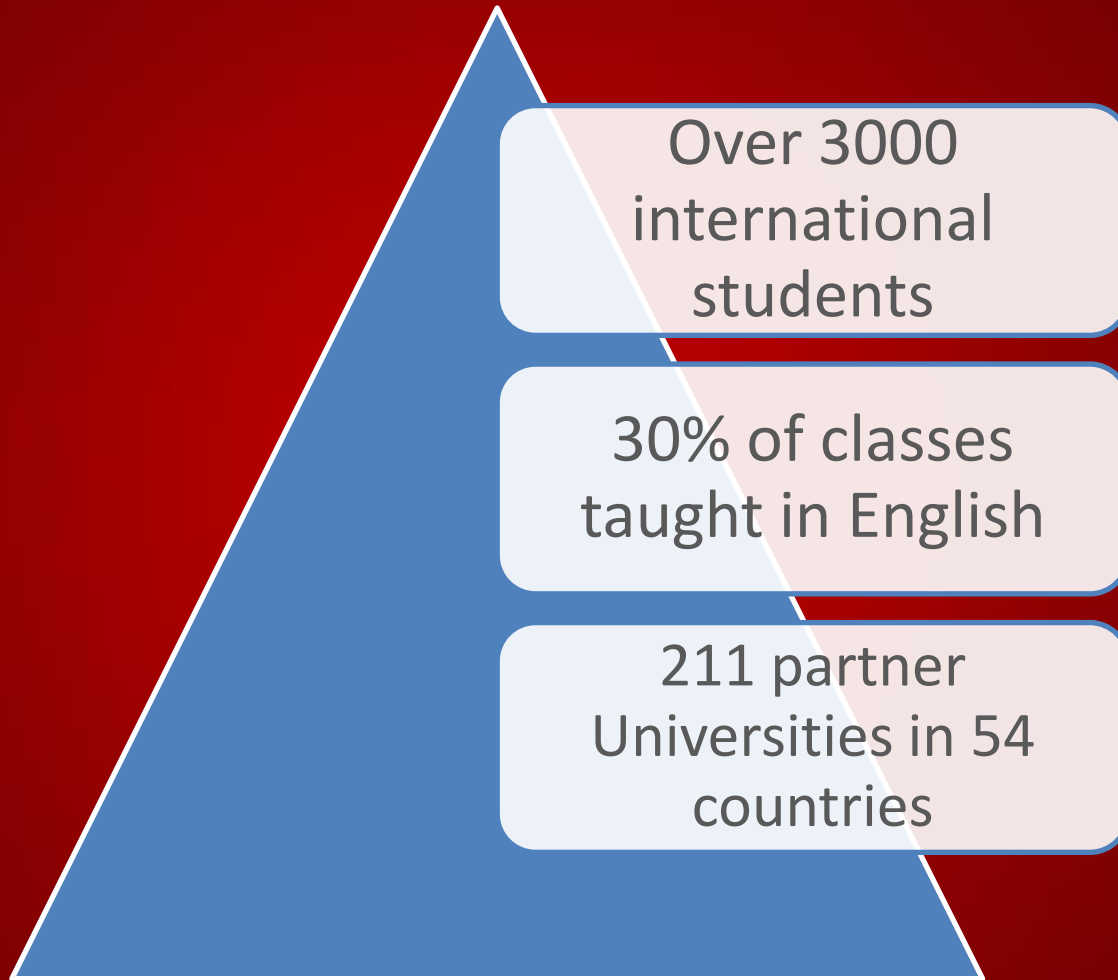
Jesuits started building an elite private university in Korea in the 1960s

Sogang University

Established in 1960, Sogang University has 8100 undergraduate students and 4000 graduate students, with 7 schools and 24 departments

Development timeline

1960 - Sogang College began as a liberal arts college with six departments-English Language and Literature, History, Philosophy, Mathematics, Physics, Economics

1968 - The Graduate school was opened with Masters' program

1970 - University Charter was granted by the Ministry of Education

1976 - Research Institute for Communications was established

1977 - Advanced Institute of Accounting was established

1981 - Research Institute for English as an International Language was established

1984 - Technology Management Institute was established

1988 - College of Social Science and Law Department were opened

1988 - Research Institute for Philosophy was established

1988 – 1999 Opened 7 Graduate Schools in 11 years

1988 - Graduate School of Public Policy was opened with three departments

1990 - Graduate School of Education was opened with ten majors

1991 - Graduate School of Economics was opened with six departments

1992 - Graduate School of Mass Communication was opened with four majors

1997 - Graduate School of International Studies was opened

1997 - Graduate School of Information and Technology was opened

1999 - Graduate School of Media Communications was opened

2009 - Law School was opened
