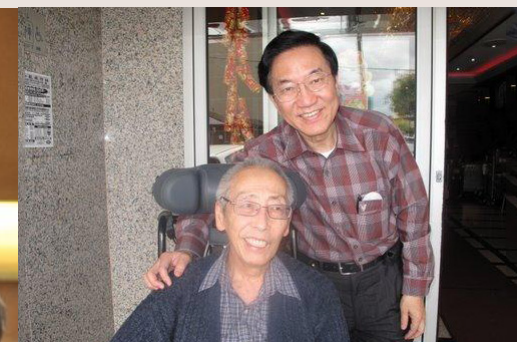

In the late 1950s, Rev. Fr. Moran organized a group of Wah Yan College, Kowloon, students into a soccer team called the Cheetahs. The students spanned four years, belonging to the graduating classes of 1958 to 1961. Besides soccer, their common link was that they all belonged to the altar servers and Sodality of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Fr. Moran was their spiritual leader, and the Cheetahs did a good job exhausting the monthly allowance Fr. Moran was receiving from the Jesuit Order.

The Cheetahs led a double life, partying hard and playing Mah Jong whenever possible. After graduation from secondary school, they headed in different directions and scattered to what seemed like the four corners of the world. The education and extracurricular activities at Wah Yan provided them with a sound foundation to meet the future challenges in life. During an era when communication and travel were costly, many of their connections and exact whereabouts were slowly lost. It was through the tremendous effort of Carmelo Leung that many of the Cheetahs were reconnected in the past few years. Very sadly, Carmelo passed away in early 2009, not being able to join the reunion of his old team. The rest of the Cheetahs will be forever indebted to him and he will always remain close to their hearts.

The Cheetahs are pleasantly surprised and indeed grateful that the passage of time has not eroded the deep bond between them. They wish for all the Wah Yan alumni to always retain a similar spirit of unity and brotherhood for all times.
